SOV's Offering of Letters Coming in April

As people of faith, we are called to care for one another and speak out for those in need. Bread for the World's 2019 Offering of Letters: Better Nutrition, Better Tomorrow urges our government to accelerate progress toward ending hunger by increasing funding for global child nutrition programs. Shepherd of the Valley will hold Offering writing on Sunday, April 7th. Educational class on this topic will be held Sunday, March 17th with a speaker to be announced later. Over the past several decades, the world—with a strong commitment from the United States—has made great progress toward ending hunger by promoting global nutrition programs. Hunger and poverty rates have been cut nearly in half during the past 30 years. In countries such as Ghana and Honduras, stunting—when a child does not grow and develop properly because of chronic malnutrition—has been reduced by nearly one-third in approximately 10 years. Making progress on malnutrition, especially among women and children, is key to ending chronic global hunger. Good nutrition during pregnancy and in the first two years of a child's life—the first 1,000 days—is critical to a child's brain development, health, and future well-being. A child's first five years of life are the riskiest and good nutrition is key to helping children survive. Babies and children have immune systems that are still developing, so they are more susceptible to illnesses and diseases. Premature births, pneumonia, diarrhea, malaria, and other illnesses result in 5.4 million deaths of children under age 5 every year. Almost half of those children die of causes related to malnutrition. Chronic under nutrition leaves 151 million children each year vulnerable to disease and stunted physical and mental growth. But by focusing on improving nutrition during the critical first 1,000 days, much of the serious and irreparable damage caused by hunger and malnutrition can be prevented. Days for Girls is an international project to supply functional feminine hygiene kits for girls living where quality supplies are unavailable. These washable re-usable supplies allow girls to go to school or work instead of staying home during their periods. Each kit contains 10 absorbent flannel pads, 2 shields to hold pads in place, 1 washcloth, 1 pair of underwear, 1 bar of soap, 2 gallon-sized plastic zip bags to transport wet/soiled items, 2 safety pins and a drawstring bag to carry everything.

The Treasure Valley has several groups making and distributing kits, including one at King of Glory Lutheran. Come hear about this project. Free will offering will go to Days for Girls.
